This wonderful building was the forerunner of Versailles. We were treated to a fabulous mid-day meal at the chateau. Later in the day we had time to spend at the graveside of the aircrew from RAF Ludford. The site is kept immaculately and the time spent there was a very moving tribute to the brave young men who gave their lives for the war effort. On the final evening we were invited to a wonderful buffet supper in the village. Gifts were exchanged and as the visit took place during the time of the Magna Carta celebrations, our gift included a print of the Magna Carta and a selection of Magna Carta ales, brewed near Runnymede.

Now back in Ludford, the Association is turning its attention to the return visit by the families from Voué in the Spring of 2017. With this in mind we will be organising a programme of events over the coming months.
